1. What is BotsIQ?

BotsIQ is the educational, not-for-profit, program originally created by the producers of the incredibly successful BattleBots television series. In BotsIQ students design and build remote controlled robots that face off or perform tasks in competition.

2. How do I register for the program?

Send an email to info@botsiq.org and we'll send you our application packet.

3. How much will it cost for me to join?

\$10 - For an individual / teacher / member / friend

\$100 - For a **single** school / youth organization / chapter

\$500 - For **2-6** schools

\$750 - For **7-10** schools

\$1000 - For **11-20** schools

4. What do I get for my money?
